Partnership Wittenborg Business School and Parkendaal Lyceum



As from September 2011, two private schools in Apeldoorn will work together: Wittenborg Business School and secondary school [Parkendaal Lyceum](#) will offer a programme to final year Parkendaal students which will prepare them for higher and scientific education in an elaborate way. Statistics show that 17% of all first year university students quit their studies prematurely. This can be the result of choosing the wrong study programme, but a heavy study load and incorrect expectations of the chosen study programme play an important role as well. The number of drop-outs can be significantly reduced if students orientate and prepare themselves well for the studies ahead of them. Students need to master beforehand a number of skills their future education demands from them. This is why the two private schools will start the so-called 'University Prep Course', which will be offered to graduating Parkendaal students.



Less International Students to England, More Brits to the Netherlands

Stricter British immigration laws cause fewer students from outside the European Union to come to England to study. At the same time, British students have become keener on studying abroad themselves. As the second-most popular European study destination for international students, the Netherlands might begin to threaten England's 1st place rank. England's announced push back of immigration will shrink the annual number of immigrants from 196,000 in 2009 to 'tens of thousands' in the coming years. Two thirds of immigrants enter England with a student visa. As a result of the change in policy, 260,000 students less will come to England from the present until 2016.



On the other hand, the number of British students enrolled for Dutch bachelor programmes, taught in English, has increased drastically compared to last year. Programmes in international business and management are the most popular. British universities fear a brain drain of about 200,000 young English people as per September. An important reason for moving is the cuts in British education. Currently yearly tuition fees amount to a maximum of € 3,750. As from 2012, universities are allowed to raise this sum to a maximum of € 9,900. Recent research shows that about 10 percent of all British students will not pay more than € 7,750 to study in a university. Furthermore, Great Britain is dealing with a shortage of study places. Up until now, British students have never been keen on studying abroad. On an international scale, Great Britain is ranked second when it comes to incoming students, yet 22nd in students going abroad.
